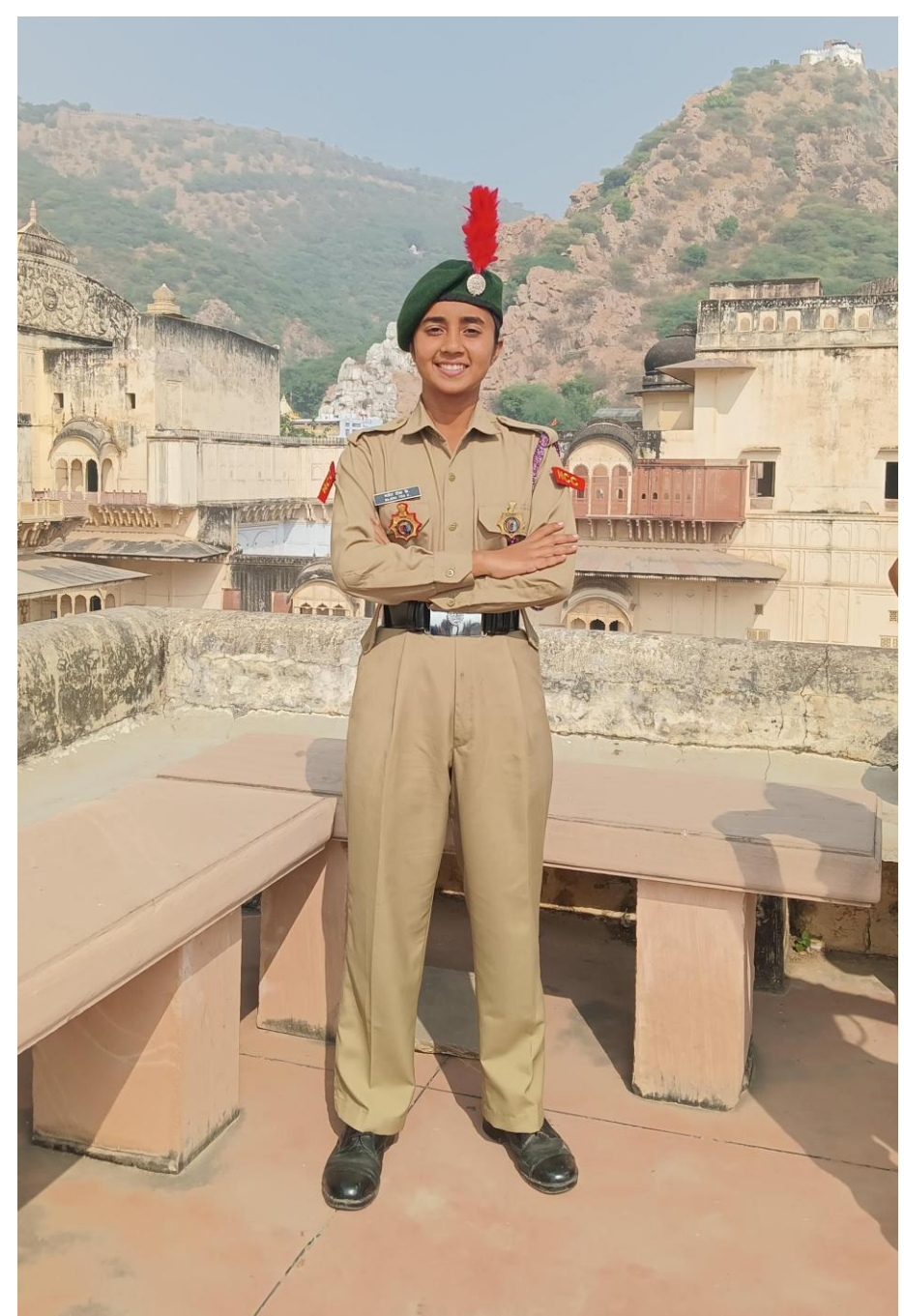

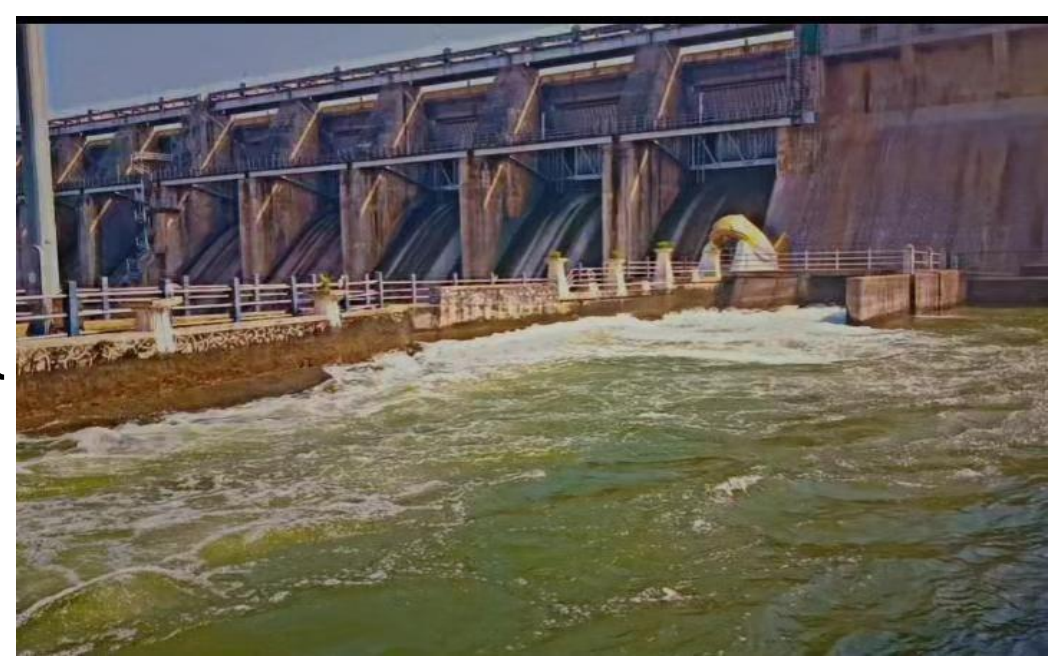

After Which The Practice Would Start Again

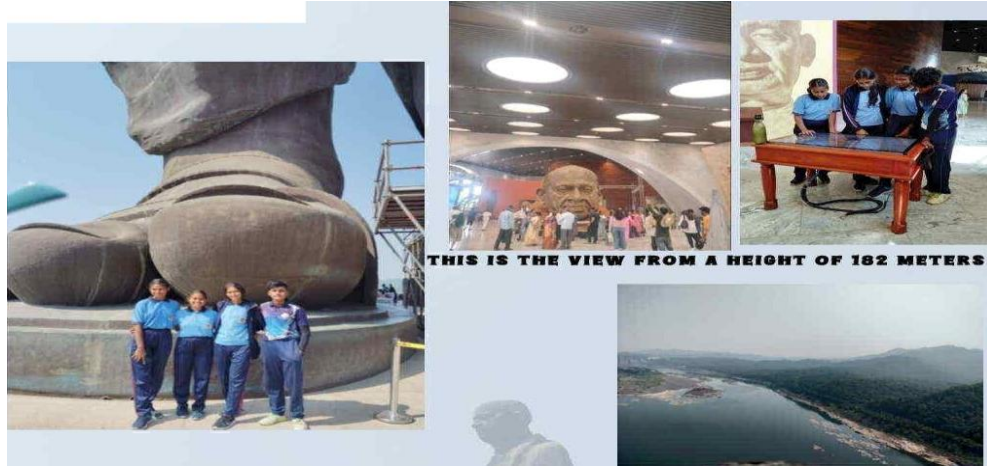
